


Hands that speak: Tonight's Pianists



Prash is a council member for the British Society for Surgery of the Hand. He was appointed as Consultant Hand and Orthopaedic surgeon at Ysbyty Gwynedd in 2011. He is a graduate of King David High School in Liverpool and the Manchester School of Medicine.

His musical journey at the piano began at eight years of age under the tutelage of the late Dennis Rattle, father of the renowned conductor Sir Simon Rattle. Prash competed and performed regularly in his teenage years but took a break from the piano for decades as he trained to be a surgeon. He currently volunteers as an organist at St Joseph's Catholic Church in Colwyn Bay.

Orthopaedic surgeon Carlvan Lee was born in Sabah, Malaysia and now practices in North Wales. Having graduated medicine from the International Medical University, Malaysia at the age of 21, he was one of the youngest medical graduates ever.

His musical gifts emerged equally early; under the tutelage of Krzysztof Slomiak and Helen Barker, he was awarded a Fellowship from Trinity College London in Piano Performance at the age of 14. He has won numerous prizes in national competitions for piano and singing in his teenage years.
